

Pangbourne Neighbourhood Action Group

1. The Pangbourne Neighbourhood Action Group is a multi agency problem solving group consisting of appointed representatives from Thames Valley Police, Local Government, Government Agencies and representatives from the Parish Councils of Pangbourne, Purley-on-Thames, Tidmarsh & Sulham, Basildon and Streatley.
2. Whilst not having statutory recognition, the group has sufficient integrity to enable other bodies to comply with all reasonable requests. The group advises and recommends actions to other establishments and is recognised by the authority of the Chief Constable.
3. The composition of the group is normally:
 - a. At least one representative from each member Parish Council
 - b. Two representatives appointed by Thames Valley Police
 - c. Co-opted members who are able to represent local stakeholders, partners, agencies and community groups, which may include the following:
 - i. West Berkshire District Council Traffic Management
 - ii. West Berkshire District Council Road Safety
 - iii. West Berkshire District Council Safer Communities Partnership
 - iv. Neighbourhood Watch
 - v. Neighbourhood Police Officers as appropriate
 - vi. Housing Association
 - vii. Representatives from the local communities
4. Actions introduced and approved by the NAG include requests to Thames Valley Police, West Berkshire District Council and other relevant agencies and individuals.
5. There are 4 meetings held in each calendar year, during the months of January, April, July and October.
6. The minutes of each meeting are circulated to all members and signed as a correct record when approved by the Chairman at the commencement of each meeting.
7. A formal agenda is prepared for each meeting. The Data Protection Act is applicable and all items discussed during meetings concerning criminal offences, Police Policy, Police records or any Police matters are confidential to members of the NAG.

8. After each NAG meeting the representative from Streatley PC presents a report to the following meeting of the Streatley Parish Council.
