

## 1. Introduction

Under Section 17 of The Crime & Disorder Act 1998 all Local Authorities, including parish councils, are duty bound to consider the impact of all their decisions, actions and functions with a view to minimising and protecting against crime and disorder.

## 2. Definition

Anti-Social Behaviour, is understood to be defined as:

*‘Acting in a manner that caused or was likely to cause harassment, alarm or distress to one or more persons not of the same household as the perpetrator’*

Such behaviour may impact on the peaceful lives of other residents.

## 3. Activities

Streatley Parish Council collaboratively work with Thames Valley Police and other key agencies regarding crime prevention to develop and maintain a safer community for residents. The Parish Council has representatives on the local NAG (Neighbourhood Action Group).

The Parish Council works with the local community to reduce crime and the fear of crime, securing improvements in services and provisions to beneficial effect, e.g. removal of abandoned vehicles, repairs to broken streetlights, potholes, and footpath trip hazards. The Parish Council also continues to publicise educational materials regarding considerate behaviours and examples of anti-social behaviour observed.
